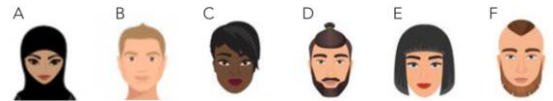
What experiences have we had of racial stereotyping?



Sometimes we develop stereotypes because of the things we hear people say and the things we see in the world around us. We need to be aware of this in order to challenge it.



These messages and pictures can affect what we think about certain groups of people. This is called racial socialisation.

Representation Matters

Representation

How media texts (e.g. books, films, TV, newspaper articles) present ideas about groups of people (e.g. gender, age, ethnicity and sexual orientation) to an audience

It also refers to how often different groups people are shown in media.

E.g. "There is poor representation of women in action films"
